Mother's Day is SUN, MAY 9. This is a great opportunity for us to express our

love for that special woman in our life who gave us life and nourished that life with her own love and life. It is also the time to thank Mary, Mother of Jesus, for being our spiritual Mother in Christ. This is a special day to honor our mothers, grandmothers, God-mothers and step-mothers, both living and deceased. One of the greatest gifts is to attend Mass with your mother and offer the intention of the Mass for her. If you cannot be physically present with your mother, or she has been called home to God, attend Mass on Mother's Day and offer the Mass for her intention.

REFLECTIONS ON MARRIAGE. This is the season when the Church celebrates a large number of weddings. It is also a good time for us to review what we as Catholics understand marriage to be. We believe that marriage is more than a contract between a man and a woman. It is a covenant relationship of love and life for the baptized, an intimate partnership rooted in the covenant of irrevocable personal consent At the wedding of Cana, Jesus showed that He Himself becomes the 3rd partner in the Christian marriage. We as Catholics validly receive the Sacrament of Matrimony when we exchange our consent with our partner in the presence of a priest and 2 witnesses. Once the covenant bond has been made it cannot be broken. However, sometimes a Catholic marriage does end in divorce. If a Catholic couple gets a civil divorce they are not free to remarry. The divorced couple can continue to receive the Sacraments as long as they don't attempt to remarry outside the Church and contradict the prior covenant. If the separated couple can give evidence to indicate that a covenant relationship doesn't exist, that for some reason there was not a free exchange of consent to the marriage, then an annulment procedure could begin If you have any questions concerning the Sacrament of Matrimony, you may call Fr. We congratulate the beautiful children listed here, and thank their families and teachers, and all who helped them come to this special day.

God keep you, dear children, always in His care, as you receive Jesus for the first time, and then very often in your life. Any may the Holy Spirit descend upon you and remain with you and guide you in your life as you mature in the Catholic faith.

Food for thought on this First Communion Day... Mei was a little Chinese girl whose mother was put in prison for refusing to surrender her Catholic faith. This was in the 1950s. Since Mei was only 3 and had nowhere else to go, she stayed with her mother. The prisoners were all guarded carefully, but Mei was allowed to run about everywhere.

Among the prisoners was a bishop and some priests. They couldn't say Mass, but there were still priests outside the prison who secretly sent in consecrated hosts hidden in loaves of bread that were sent to the prisoners. In that way the prisoners were able to receive Communion. Once a Chinese woman was in solitary confinement and

nobody was allowed to visit her, but the guards did not count Mei as somebody. So the little girl took the Blessed Sacrament to her. The host was hidden in her closed fist, demurely held in her sleeves.

When Mei's mother was released, they returned to their village. There was still a missionary priest there, and Mei kept asking him to allow her to receive Communion. She was only 4, but she knew all about it and how precious it was. The priest let her make her First Communion and a month later Mei was Confirmed. Hopefully, every parent, grandparent, Godparent and sponsor will try to make our faith as precious for the children in their care as Mei's mother did for her.

May seems to be a great month for celebrations. Families will celebrate First Communions, graduations, Mother's Day, weddings, ordinations, anniversaries of ordinations - all capped off by Memorial Day and the beginning of summer. Celebrations are good. They are opportunities of sharing with one another in the love of God's family. We meet and talk and eat and share our lives. Usually occasioned by an honored event for a few people (communicants, mothers, newly-married, married couples), the celebration widens to celebrate all of us. In First Communion we all celebrate the nourishing food of Christ; in the priesthood we celebrate our baptismal priesthood of sacrificial love to others; in marriage we all celebrate the Father's eternal promise of love for us in one another. So celebrate! And at every celebration, no matter what it is, celebrate in each other, in yourself, in God who celebrates us!

As I shared with you, I will be celebrating my 40th anniversary of priesthood ordination with a Mass and reception on SUN, MAY 30, beginning at 2pm at St. Aloysius. All of you are invited to share in this special occasion with me.

Many of you have asked me, "How can I help?" Well ... we ARE in need of an assortment of cookies for the celebration. If you can bake any or all kinds of cookies, it would help a lot. What kind of celebration would it be without a cookie table?! I've been bragging to my family and friends about what great bakers we have in our parishes.
