### FIRST READING: EXODUS 24:3-8

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the Lord has told us." Moses then wrote down all the words of the Lord and, rising early the next day, he erected at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve pillars for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent certain young men of the Israelites to offer holocausts and sacrifice young bulls as peace offerings to the Lord, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar.

Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, "All that the Lord has said, we will heed and do." Then he took the blood and sprinkled it on the people, saying, "This is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words of his."

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:** *I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord.*

### SECOND READING: HEBREWS 9:11-15

Brothers and sisters: When Christ came as high priest of the good things that have come to be, passing through the greater and more perfect tabernacle not made by hands, that is, not belonging to this creation, he entered once for all into the sanctuary, not with the blood of goats and calves but with his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes can sanctify those who are defiled so that their flesh is cleansed, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God. For this reason he is mediator of a new covenant: since a death has taken place for deliverance from transgressions under the first covenant, those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance.

Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"'" Today in the Church we celebrate the **FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**. This feast is also known by its Latin name "CORPUS CHRISTI".



Corpus Christi

To recall the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, when sorrow over the Passion, hinders a proper celebration, this feast was established and is celebrated on the THU (or SUN) after Trinity Sunday. It owes its origin to the progressive development of worship and devotion to the Blessed Eucharist in the Middle Ages, and to a revelation to St. Juliana of Liege, where it was first celebrated as a local feast. In 1264 it was extended to the Universal Church.




**THE CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION.** In the 13th century, a Belgian nun named Juliana had a vision: she saw the full moon silvery and radiant except for one dark spot. The meaning of the vision was revealed to her: the moon was the Church's liturgical year, the dark spot a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Today's Feast of *Corpus Christi* - the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - grew from Juliana's vision. On this feast, many parishes observe the traditional *Corpus Christi* procession, giving honor to the Eucharist by carrying this greatest treasure out of the safety of our churches and into our streets. At the end of every Mass we are not just let out, we are sent forth, strengthened by the Eucharist, to be the Body of Christ in the world. The *Corpus Christi* procession is the dismissal writ large! We take Jesus with us, not only in our hearts, but carried in our midst and exposed in a monstrance. It is a public profession of faith and a blessing of the world. Jesus walks with us on these streets that we walk day after day, among those who know him but yearn to know him better, and among those who do not know him. The Eucharist is a mystery to be believed, to be celebrated - and to be lived.

BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST  
Hebrews 9:11-15  
THE BLOOD OF CHRIST**

At communion time, many Catholics do not partake of the Blood of Christ. Some churches do not offer it. In those that do, some people abstain. Some worry about the sanitation of drinking from a common cup. Others probably find the idea of "drinking blood" a bit repulsive. Perhaps it is. But so is the idea of "eating flesh." Our communion in Christ is a bold gesture of faith and commitment.

Drinking the Blood of Christ is an important expression of our faith. Jesus asked his followers at the Last Supper to eat his Body and drink his Blood. He didn't recommend just one or the other.

The Letter to the Hebrews expresses the significance of the Blood of Christ.

In the past, the high priest entered the Holy of Holies, the heart of the temple, with the blood of goats and calves. The sprinkling of this blood forgave the sins of those who were defiled.

When Christ ascended into heaven, he entered the holiest of holy places. He brought with him his own blood - for our sakes. "How much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself unblemished to God, cleanse our consciences from dead works to worship the living God." Drinking the Blood of Christ forgives our sins, frees us from "dead works," and makes us more worthy to worship. It is an act of faith, thanksgiving, and forgiveness.


