

### FIRST READING: EXODUS 20:1-17

In those days, God delivered all these commandments: "I, the LORD, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery. You shall not have other gods besides me. You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or worship them. For I, the Lord, your God, am a jealous God, inflicting



punishment for their fathers' wickedness on the children of those who hate me, down to the third and fourth generation; but bestowing mercy down to the thousandth generation on the children of those who love me and keep my commandments. "You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain. For the Lord will not leave unpunished the one who takes his name in vain. "Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord, your God. No work may be done then either by you, or your son or daughter, or your male or female slave, or your beast, or by the alien who lives with you. In six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them; but on the seventh day he rested. That is why the Lord has blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. "Honor your father and your mother, that you may have a long life in the land which the Lord, your God, is giving you. You shall not kill. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. ### SECOND READING: I CORINTHIANS 1:22-25

Brothers and sisters: Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, Jews and Greeks alike, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength.

### GOSPEL: JOHN 2:13-25

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money



changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, *Zeal for your house will consume me*. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." The Jews said, "This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

### NICENE CREED

### POSTURES OF THE MASS

In the Mass, we pray not only with our lips, but with our bodies as well. We stand when the ministers enter as a sign of attention, a mark of respect. Standing is also a posture of prayer, mentioned often in the Old Testament. When the readings begin, we sit down: a listening posture. Mary sat at Jesus' feet to listen to him; crowds sat on the hillside or seashore to hear him. Kneeling is another posture that is full of meaning. It expresses adoration and worship, and also humility and contrition. We bow: a sign of honor and reverence, acknowledging the presence of God, especially when we receive the Eucharist. And there are other ritual gestures as well - striking the breast, genuflecting, and of course making the sign of the cross. The liturgy invites us to pray with our whole person - with heart and mind, voice and body.

The Connellsville-Dunbar Catholic Community will sponsor a live-streamed musical program at 7pm on MON of Holy Week, MAR 29. ## JESUS AS TEACHER: THE HIGHEST QUALIFICATIONS

It is great to learn from a master.

Whether it be carpentry or cooking, piano playing or business administration, there is nothing like learning from someone with a good background of experience. Such people have gained practical wisdom. They have learned what works and what doesn't.

Jesus was often called "Master". Living what he taught, he had high qualifications. Evidently this was obvious to people, because they flocked out to hear him. The disciples, Jesus' inner group, gradually came to realize that Jesus' qualifications went even beyond practical wisdom. One time he asked them, "Who do people say that I am?" Peter answered: "You are the Christ." Jesus was a supreme teacher, because his knowledge came directly from the One who set our lives in order.

We all have the privilege of learning from the very best.



We learn by both listening and doing. We are present day disciples. The old values we found in fishing or in any day-to-day activity are not the sum total of our life possibilities. They are essential to keeping body and soul together, but each of us has inner spiritual potential that can enrich both our own lives and the life of the world around us.

We learn from our Master Teacher in 2 ways. The scriptural account of Jesus' life and teaching helps us to understand what is of highest worth. For example, he draws a contrast between the arrogant show of rich men, who put large gifts into the temple treasury, and the heartfelt generosity of a poor widow, who gave only a couple copper coins. Jesus saw in her gift a greater value than all the others put together. Jesus revealed life's highest values.

When we are open to it, we also learn by having Jesus' living presence within us. The resurrection is a continuing, every day event, as we sense Christ's Spirit as a guiding presence within.



### The bells are ringing once again at St. Al's!

Last week parishioners who were coming to church, and people in the area around our complex in Dunbar, heard the bells from our tower again after a few years' absence. At the end of FEB the Verdin Company installed a new set of electrical bells, replacing the outdated and unfixable system we had. Two parishioners came forward



## THE SCRUTINY RITES



The word scrutiny means "search". The Lenten scrutinies are rites of searching. They are meant to heal all that is weak or sinful in the hearts of the people chosen for baptism at Easter. These chosen people are called "the elect". The scrutiny rites usually take place on the 3rd, 4th and 5th SUNs of Lent. When the scrutiny rites are celebrated on the 3rd SUN of Lent we hear about the Samaritan woman who met and spoke with Jesus at a well. On the 4th SUN we hear about the cure of a man who was born blind. On the 5th SUN we hear about the raising of Lazarus from the dead. These stories are from the Gospel of John. Each story is about a "Passover" - from dishonor to truth, from blindness to sight, from death to life. During a scrutiny rite, the elect step forward with their godparents. They bow their heads or kneel. Everyone in church prays for them. They ask God to give the elect a "sense of sin". That's a powerful gift - to know what sin is like, to understand the difference between good and evil. The church prays that the elect will be free from Satan's power. The church knows too well that evil has power. But we know also that Christ can free us from this power.

WATER IN THE DESERT**

In the desert of our lives there are plenty of complaints. Bills are too high. Friends are too few. Health is too frail. Faith is too weak. In the desert of our lives there is plenty of blame. Our leaders are unconcerned. Children are too demanding. Society is sinful. Life is not fair.

In the desert, the people of Israel grumble against Moses. They have too little water, and they are blaming Moses. Moses blames God and asks for some divine intervention.

God promises Moses, "I will stand in front of you on the rock." Moses strikes that rock, and water gushes forth.

Life brings its share of struggle. We sometimes rebel against the very place where God has invited us to be. We forget that God has given us life, has entered into covenant with us, and stands ever before us. So we complain. We may not realize that we are standing right at the water for which we thirst.

The discomforts of your life will not be hard to name. Have you brought some of them on yourself? Has God placed some of them in your path? Do you trust that God stands with you, water at the ready? From where will that water come?


