

FIRST READING: ACTS OF THE APOSTLES 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then

how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth.*

SECOND READING: I CORINTHIANS 12:3B-7, 12-13

Brothers and sisters: No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit. There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

Pastors Notes

1. There will be NO 9am Mass at St. Al on SUN, MAY 30. That Mass has been canceled on this SUN only because of the preparations for the anniversary celebration later that day.
2. Beginning this past MON, MAY 17, the pews in all 4 of our churches will no longer be blocked. We are able to accommodate parishioners in any of our pews and choirs in the choir lofts.
3. We will still need your help cleaning and sanitizing pews after every liturgy.
4. Individuals are no longer required to wear masks in church. Those who are not fully vaccinated are strongly urged to wear masks for their own protection and for the protection of others. Parishes should post signs requesting the unvaccinated or those at risk, to continue to wear masks.
5. Churches and times of weekend Masses will remain the same as they are now, until a time in the near future.
6. The suspension of Obligation of Mass attendance on SUNs and Holy Days of Obligation remains in effect.
7. Live-streaming of SUN Masses should continue wherever feasible.

ON FEB 11, 2018, POPE FRANCIS DECREED THAT LATIN-RITE CATHOLICS AROUND THE WORLD WOULD MARK THE FEAST OF "THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH" ON THE MON AFTER PENTECOST EACH YEAR. The Gospel reading for the feast, technically is called a "memorial", is John 19:25-31, which recounts how from the cross, Jesus entrusted Mary to his disciples as their mother, and entrusted his disciples to Mary as her children. Pope Francis approved the decree

after "having attentively considered how greatly the promotion of this devotion might encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the church in the pastors, religious and faithful, as well as a growth of genuine Marian piety". The Vatican prelates in the decree recalled that "as a caring guide to the emerging Church, Mary had already begun her mission in the Upper Room, praying with the Apostles while awaiting the coming of the Holy Spirit." Then, in the course of the centuries, "Christian piety has honored Mary with various titles" and now under the title "Mother of the Church".

In case you forgot to RSVP for Fr. Paul's 40th anniversary celebration, please call your church office anytime this week with the total number attending from your family. Mass will be at 2pm at St. Al's, with a reception following on their church grounds until 8pm. *The RSVP is requested only to have a reasonable count for the picnic buffet.* Incidentally, the 2pm Mass satisfies the SUN obligation. Also, Holy Communion may be received again even if received earlier in the day. (This is a general allowance, to be able to receive Holy Communion twice in a single day at 2 different Masses.)

TODAY WE CELEBRATE PENTECOST SUNDAY.

One of the biblical names for Pentecost is "The Festival of First Fruits". A "first fruit" is the first of a crop to ripen. These were offered to God in thanksgiving for the harvest. We usually don't think of this time of year as a harvest season. But in mild climates, such as the lands around the Mediterranean, the apricots, strawberries and cherries are ripe now. So are wheat and other grains. The grain harvest is the principal harvest of the year, the crop that can feed people all year long if it is abundant enough. Even in the north, gardens yield asparagus, rhubarb, the first peas and spinach and other salad greens. Winter's fast has become springtime's feast.

In the First Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul uses the imagery of Pentecost to speak of the resurrection of Jesus. "Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruit of those who have died. All will be made alive in Christ, but each in proper order: First Christ, then all those who belong to Christ." Christians celebrate Pentecost 50 days after Easter Sunday. Pentecost is a Greek word that means either "50 days" or "50th day". Pentecost sets a seal on the 50 days of Eastertime. It is a grand finale. On Pentecost, Christians celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The Gospels speak often of the coming of the Spirit. John's Gospel tells us that when Jesus died, "He bowed His head and gave up His spirit." John tells us that the Risen

Christ breathed on the disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." In the Acts of the Apostles we hear of a great outpouring of the Spirit, who descended in fires and wind on the disciples, just as God appeared to Moses on Mount Sinai. At Jesus' baptism, the Holy Spirit appeared in the form of a dove that descended on Jesus. In Luke's Gospel, we hear over and over that Jesus was filled with the power of the Spirit. In the Acts of the Apostles, the descent of the Spirit happens over and over to the disciples. Pentecost is made new again at every baptism, every Eucharist, every time two or more gather in Jesus' name.

THE REASON FOR GIFTS



Look around your church and you will see many gifts. You will see those who sing and those who read, those who preach and those who greet. You will see some who feed the hungry and others who serve on committees. You will see some who decorate and others who converse. Some have a gift for leading prayer, for parenting children, or for making people feel at home. Everybody has some gift.

Still, not all gifts are equal. Some people excel at their gifts. Others exercise them less capably. The quality of the gift is not that important. It is important to exercise the gift, whatever its extent may be. The use of our gifts releases the power of the Spirit. St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians,

“To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.”

God gives gifts for a reason. They are meant to be nurtured and used. The gifts manifest the Spirit. When used properly, they draw attention to God who gives, not to the person who has received.

The manifold gifts within one community show the marvels of the Holy Spirit. When people share their gifts, they create a spirit of selflessness and inspire others to service. They help everyone appreciate the goodness of God, who gives even before we ask.

When people look at you, they also see gifts. For which gifts are you most grateful? How do you share them?


