**MON, OCT 19, IS THE FEAST DAY OF STS. ISAAC JOGUES, JOHN DE BRÉBEUF AND COMPANIONS.**

When Europeans explored and conquered the Americas, the French settled in the regions north of the St. Lawrence River and around the Great Lakes. They called the area New France. The French were more interested in trading than in mining or farming, so they were somewhat less envious of the native American lands than were the Spanish or English settlers. Still, like other European settlers, they took the best hunting grounds. The native Americans learned to distrust them.

Into this difficult situation Jesuit missionaries came from France to preach the gospel to the native American peoples of the area. The missionaries started with the Hurons, whose way of life was more settled than other tribes. A mission base was built at a place called Sainte-Marie, some distance from the Indian villages. A small hospital, a fort and a cemetery were built there, and sometimes the Jesuits visited other tribes from this headquarters.

After more than 20 years of work with the Hurons, the Jesuits found increasing acceptance of the Christian message. The missionaries looked for ways to be of service to the people, especially in times of illness. However, because of their friendship with the Hurons, the Jesuits earned the hatred of the Iroquois, the enemies of the Hurons.

Over an 8 year period 7 lay missionaries and priests were murdered. Most of them were tortured before they died. René Goupil was the first to be killed. Isaac Jogues was held captive over a year before he was ransomed by Dutch Protestants. Later he returned, hoping to help work out a peace treaty between the Hurons and the Iroquois. When it was completed, he was captured by a war party and killed, along with lay missionary, John Lalande. Gabriel Lalement and John de Brébeuf were killed only 4-5 weeks after Lalement's arrival at the Huron missions. De Brébeuf, the leader of the team, had worked there for 24 years. He had composed catechisms and a dictionary in the Huron language. Anthony Daniel, the parish priest at the settlement of St. Joseph, went out alone to meet the Iroquois when they attacked. He hoped that the Hurons would be spared because of his death. Charles Garnier was shot down when the settlement of St. Ignace was raided. Noël Chabanel was killed by a Huron Christian, angry about the changes brought by the Europeans.

These men were the first Christian martyrs of the North American continent. Every year many pilgrims visit their shrines at Auriesville, New York, and at Midland, Ontario.

## OCT - RESPECT FOR LIFE MONTH

I would like to say a special word to women who have had an abortion. The Church is aware of the many factors which may have influenced your decision, and she does not doubt that in many cases it was a painful and even shattering decision. The wound in your heart may not have healed. Certainly what has happened was and remains terribly wrong. But do not give in to discouragement and do not lose hope. Try rather to understand what happened and face it honestly. If you have not already done so, give yourselves over with humility and trust to repentance. The Father of mercies is ready to give you his forgiveness and his peace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. You will come to understand that nothing is definitively lost, and you will also be able to ask forgiveness from your child, who is now living in the Lord.

## FRI, OCT 23, is the Feast of St. John of Capistrano (1386-1456)

The life of John Capistrano can be summed up in one word: conversion. He was a lawyer, and became mayor of Perugia in Italy at the age of 16. But all that meant nothing when he was taken as a prisoner of war a few years later. In the loneliness of his cell he resolved to change his life.



Once freed, John became a Franciscan novice. His teacher was Bernardine of Siena. Over time, John became Bernardine's assistant in preaching throughout Europe. John also helped in Bernardine's task of reforming the Franciscan order which had moved away from Francis' ideals. After Bernardine died, John wrote his life story and continued preaching, addressing thousands of hearers each day.

John served as a diplomat and advisor to popes. He worked for harmony between the eastern and western churches.

**I Thessalonians 1:1-5b**  
**STAYING ALIVE**

Faith, hope, and love are signs of a community alive. They show human activity inspired by God.

The first letter to the Thessalonians describes such a community. The letter was written by Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy to a church founded by word and power. The missionaries had preached the good news by their words, but the Holy Spirit had added power to their preaching. The success of this venture was evident in three ways: faith, hope, and love.

The writers of the letter give thanks to God, "unceasingly calling to mind your work of faith and labor of love and endurance in hope of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Even today, a good Christian community - whether a family or a parish - is noted by faith, hope, and love. Christians have faith in God and demonstrate that faith by their worship together and prayer in private. Faith prompts believers to work for the sake of the Gospel, spreading the good news of Jesus Christ.

For Christian communities, love is a labor. It brings happiness and it starts from feelings of joy, but it demands hard work and patience. Communities thrive when the members are willing to do the hard work of love.

Hope permits endurance. Waiting for the coming of Christ, we hope in his word. That hope helps us continue when the struggle gets hard. Faith, hope, and love keep communities alive.


