

From week to week, we are called to unite and reunite in the oneness of the family we now are, the family we shall be forever. This is why we are called to come together so regularly, not for the sermon or the ceremony, but for the presence of one another in the Father and His People.



APR 18, 2021 Acts 13-15, 17-19 Overcoming Blunders

Once in a while we make bad choices. Really bad choices. They make us feel like all is lost. What could make us feel better? We'd feel better if we knew that other people have made worse mistakes than we did and that they somehow overcame their bad choices.

Surely no one made worse choices than the people subjected to Peter's sermon in Acts of the Apostles. Peter tells them God gave them Jesus, but they handed him over to Pilate and missed the opportunity to grant him freedom. They asked freedom for a murderer instead.

God overcame this blunder with the mightiest act in history: God raised Jesus from the dead. Peter and others witnessed the Risen Jesus.

Peter's audience had made some really bad choices. They had the chance to spare Jesus from death, but instead they were responsible for it.

All was not lost. "Repent and be converted," Peter told them, "that your sins may be wiped away." And look who's talking - a man who denied lesus three times and who said, "I love you," three times.

We have the same opportunity whenever we make bad choices. We can repent and change our ways. The God who raised lesus has the power to forgive us. God can raise us up from despair to hope.
